Jumping Feet



Learning Goal:

Develop impulse control and flexible thinking while hopping alongside friends and caregivers.

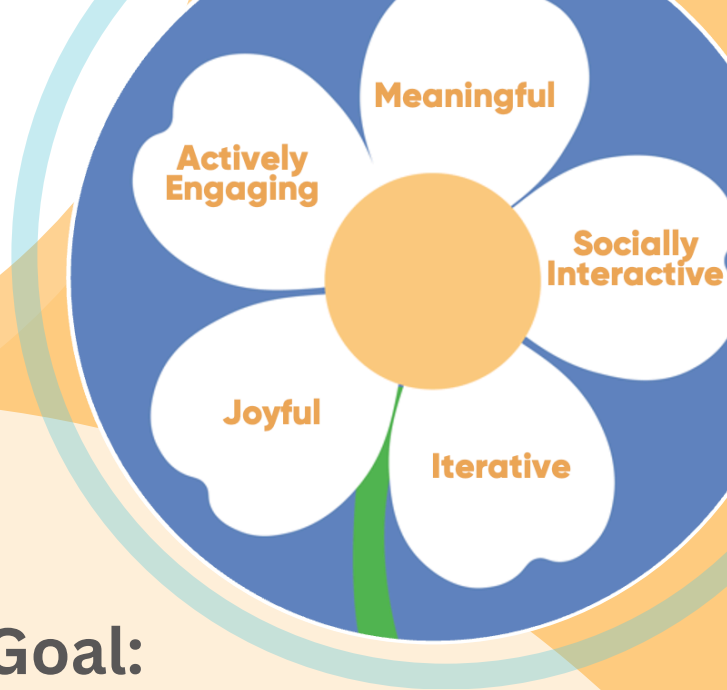
Materials:

Sidewalk chalk

Instructions:

Using sidewalk chalk, draw a hopscotch course. Instead of playing a typical game of hopscotch, jump on one foot where you see two squares, and jump on two feet where you see one square! Make sure you take turns and snap a picture of the fun!

2 Scavenger Hunt



Learning Goal:

Exercise critical thinking skills while practicing decision-making and exploration.

Materials:

Your eyes and your big brain!

Instructions:

Go down the list and find each item! Once you have found each item, take a picture of your collection.

1. Find an item that can be used in multiple ways! How many ways can you use this item?
2. Find something that you like to share with a friend! What do you do with it?
3. Find an item that brings a smile to your face, something that sparks joy and happiness. Is there a story behind this item? Share with your friends or family!

5. Find an item that is special to you. What is the story behind this object?
